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Conversation with a Scammer on LinkedIn

I received a very unusual private message on my LinkedIn social media site that initially had me scratching my head. The person sending the message seemingly did not herself have a profile on the site and was identified only by the name "LinkedIn Member." That was the first red flag.

I have had this happen to me before, so I was aware that this could happen, but the previous times I simply cut off the conversation and reported it to LinkedIn. This time, however, I decided to engage the person to see more specifically what was going on. While I never found out for sure, based on the way the person was engaging me, it felt like an attempted scam of some type where the person was trying to get personal information from me. In the beginning, I simply tried to brush the person off, but she was persistent so I decided to turn the situation around and use it as a witnessing opportunity.

Under circumstances like what exists on LinkedIn, this person actually had a way to look at my profile and was able to find out certain things about me – nothing extremely personal, but enough to engage me in a somewhat familiar way.

But since this person did not have a profile for me to look at, there was no way for me to know who this person really was. Just a warning, if you ever try to engage people like this yourself, be extra vigilant to be sure they don't get information they can actually use to scam you.

Because this was so suspicious, during the process of engaging this person, I still felt compelled

to contact the LinkedIn administration and let them know what was going on. I did that hoping that they would respond quickly enough to actually see what was happening. Ultimately they did contact me (but not until the next day) and indicated they were going to investigate. I have not heard back from them since, so at this point I still don't know any more.

My point in sharing this conversation here, though, is to show that there are all kinds of ways to share a witness for Christ, even to scammers on social media. (BTW, I also do this to scammers who send me porn links by e-mail by replying to their e-mails with a witness for Christ.) These are, obviously, people who do not know God and who need to hear about His love for them.

Hello

Are you the person who did the charity work at E Park Ave last weekend? We talked, but I don't know your name

Julie Foster

Freddy Davis

Not me.

LinkedIn Member

I'm sorry because that person looks like you and even though I got the wrong person I'm glad to meet you and I hope my message didn't disturb you.

Sorry I don't know what I should do for you to see my profile. This is also a learning exercise Can you teach me please?

Go to your profile page, copy the URL and paste it in here.

No I have a profile, but I don't know why you can't see it

Ok I will try

The message comes up: "This page doesn't exist. Please check your URL or return to LinkedIn home."

Is this because of linkedin membership? Maybe from somewhere you can open such access?

Emily Hill. Like I said above do you volunteer on weekends?

No I don't. Volunteer where?

LinkedIn Member

It's weird it feels like you're teasing me and I said the address in the first sentence.

Not teasing. I told you it was not me.

Ok but I've told you where it is. I assume you do a lot of volunteering too, right?

What kind of volunteering are you talking about? Doing what?

Why are you asking me these questions?

Just getting to know each other if you also like to do charity activities maybe we can become friends in the future we can plan to organize charity activities together. We can also talk about work things maybe we can also become partners

Where do you go to church?

Church?

Yeah. Where do you go to church?

LinkedIn Member

Sorry I'm an atheist, but I respect every religion.

Really? How can you possibly believe that something came out of nothing? It is completely anti-science.

Really

What is your faith?

I am Christian. God exists, has revealed Himself, and we can know Him in a personal relationship.

I know a little about Christianity and I'm interested in knowing more. May I ask you if I can learn more from you?

I'm sorry can I know what the situation is?
